

Tump 53 Education Programme FAQs

What is the site capacity? Can 2 classes visit at the same time?

The site is best suited to 1 class of up to 32 students visiting at a time. This stops the site from feeling overcrowded and busy during exploration.

How long do sessions last at Tump 53?

Sessions are either half day or full day. A half-day session is 2 hours. A full day session is 2 hours in the morning and 2 hours in the afternoon with a break for lunch.

How much does a visit for my class cost?

Half day visits are £90.00. Full day visits are £180.00.

What are the timings for a session?

Morning sessions are usually 10:00am – 12:00pm. Afternoon sessions are usually 1:00pm – 3:00pm. If your school are sending a class in the morning and afternoon then we can be very flexible with timings for the day – as long as there is at least a 30 minute break for lunch.

I want to do an activity that's not listed, can we try something new?

It is sometimes possible to arrange and jointly plan bespoke activities- particularly if it helps you bring to life a new class topic or story book.

Who leads the sessions at Tump 53?

Sessions are planned and delivered by Peabody Outdoor Education Officers. All staff have an enhanced DBS check, hold a current 2 day first aid certificate and have a wealth of experience and passion for teaching in the outdoors.

In some instances it is possible for schools and other organisations to hire the site and deliver their own activities.

How many adults need to accompany a class on a visit to Tump 53?

It's best to discuss this when you book as it can depend on the age of the children and the activities you want to do. In most cases a minimum of 4 adults are needed for a class of 32 children to visit the site.
